This term Kiwi and Tui class have implemented food preparation in Early Years.

Through exploration, children learn useful and appropriate ways to find out what they want to know and begin to understand their own individual ways of learning and being creative.

Learning outcome

Children develop working theories through observing, listening, doing, participating, discussing, and representing within the topics and activities provided in the programme.

Preparing fruit satay where children were given opportunities to take responsibility for their own learning. A huge emphasis is placed on health, safety and hygiene.

The children learned to use kitchen knives to cut fresh fruits. The activity promoted learning that enhanced their sensory, literacy and numeracy skills.
