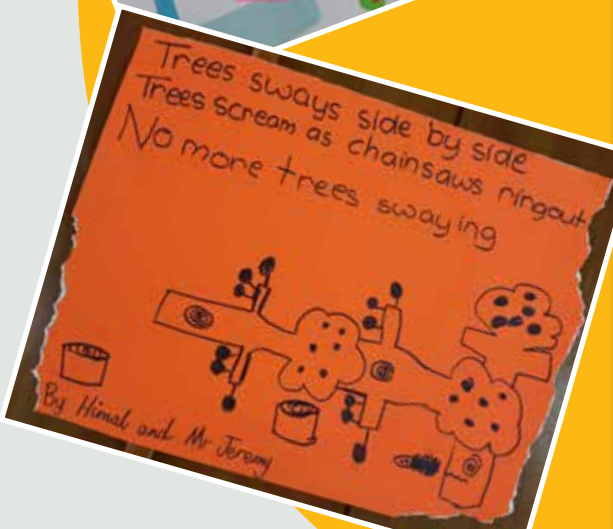
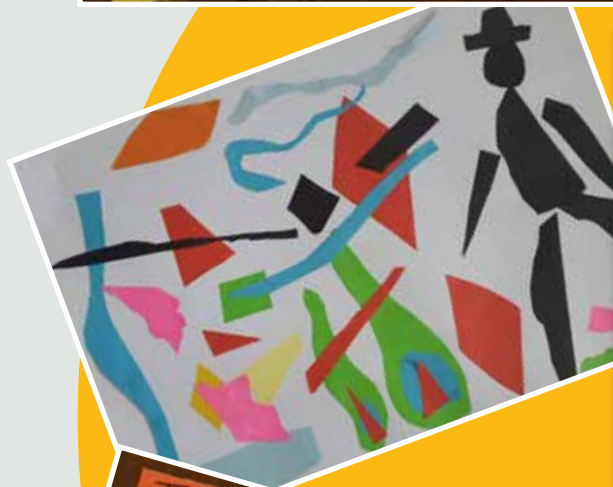
Rangatira

What is a Zoo?

A zoo is a place where you can see animals. Some are wild and some are not wild. Some of the visitors can touch the animals. We can ride some animals if we want, for example, ride horses and camels. It is a good place to visit different types of animals. Adults and children can visit.

It is usually located in the city or some in far away places. Some are located beside roads where many people travel and also live. Some of the zoos open at night.

Animals live in a small cage or a big cage and some of the animals lived together or alone. Zoos have fake habitats so that animals may live there. Sometimes people put animals in a small cage or in a big cage. Some of the zoo keepers let people feed the animals. The zoo keepers sometimes put their favorite food in their cages. They also make lakes for the animals.

There are many animals in a zoo and some of the animals are rare. Some of the animals in the zoo are from other countries or other places. There are types of animals like monkeys, tigers, giraffes, zebras, hippos, peacocks, lions, horses, camels, pandas and dolphin.

The people who are found, include the zoo keepers, animal hospital, workers, visitors and people are learning about animals. Sometimes teachers and students go to the zoo to learn about animals.

In some zoos visitors can feed the animals. Some can be dangerous to feed the animals. If you see people feed the animals when they are not allowed to feed them, they will be in great trouble. When animals are sick, they call the vet so they can heal animals. The vet knows everything about animals, because they learn about animals all the time. Sometimes they put the animal in the zoo for a while then release them later to the wild.

Heat a large saucepan over a medium heat, cook the garlic and chilli and olive oil until the garlic is golden brown.
